



Monitoring

Determine pest populations

- 1. Traps
- 2. Pheromone lures
- 3. Recordkeeping

Inspecting

Look for signs

- 1. Pests (actual)
- 2. Signs of pests (poo, etc.)
- 3. Pest conductive conditions

Pest Reduction

Sanitation

Remove conductive elements

- 1. Food
- 2. Water
- 3. Waste and other shelter
- 4. Good housekeeping

Exclusion

Prevent pest entry

- 1. Routine maintenance
- 2. Pest-proofing
- 3. Seal openings
